No. 6 – Burning of the Greens

During the 1950s, the Alexandria Harmonizers participated in the "Burning of the Greens," an Alexandria winter celebration of Epiphany with blazing Christmas trees, followed by a Chapter "Heatglow" at the Bennett residence. The Twelfth Night tradition was continued in later years with a Harmonizer performance at Goodwin House and the Heatglow fellowship at the Werner home.

The Alexandria Chapter gradually became an effective and admired non-profit arts organization with a focus on artistic excellence, community outreach, and musical education, especially for youth.

Over the years the Harmonizers have enjoyed the mutual goodwill and support of Alexandria's Mayor and City Council; Alexandria Department of Recreation, Parks and Cultural Activities; Alexandria Commission for the Arts; Alexandria Chamber of Commerce; Alexandria Arts Forum; Alexandria Convention and Visitors Association; Virginia Commission for the Arts; Cultural Alliance of Greater Washington; Washington DC Convention and Visitors Association; Chorus America; and Contemporary A Cappella Society of America.
